

**PROPOSAL:  
RELOCATION OF THE SECONDARY TUITION CENTRE (STC) ELDON ROAD,  
EDMONDON N9 AND THE SWAN ANNEX, HIGH ST, PONDERERS END EN3 SITES  
ON TO ONE NEW PURPOSE BUILT FACILITY AT BULLSMOOR LANE, ENFIELD  
EN1**

Notice is given that the London Borough of Enfield, PO Box 56, Civic Centre, Silver Street, Enfield, EN1 3XQ intends to co-locate the current STC , under section 5 Department for Education, Making “prescribed alterations” to maintained schools – Statutory guidance for proposers and decision makers, April 2016.

It is proposed that the co-located STC will be known as the Orchardside School (AP) and will open in January 2018. The school's ethos is to provide holistic support to ensure students have an opportunity to address issues that may be barriers to their engagement, learning, progress and life chances through a variety of interventions and opportunities. ESTC actively work towards learner reintegration back into mainstream provision (where possible), and therefore parents are encouraged to be in agreement with these aims to support their child's successful placement in an Enfield school. For students who attend ESTC in KS4 or have complex needs that would be a barrier to them successfully reintegrating back into mainstream school we aim for each of them to achieve GCSE's or the equivalent, a vocational experience and a range of skills to help them be successful in post 16 education and adult life. All students in KS4 have extended careers advice and support to find suitable programmes and courses for post 16.

There are no anticipated adverse impacts of the proposal as the school will continue to operate in the same manner as the current school sites. A traffic impact assessment carried out on Bullsmoor Lane. As part of this scheme has shown that there will be less traffic and vehicle movement connected with the school than with the former use as a commercial plant nursery.

The leadership, management and staffing arrangements have been reviewed and restructured to enable the schools ethos, aims and objectives to be implemented and achieved from the date of the school opening.

The school sites currently serve the community of Enfield and there will be no change to this. The new facilities have been designed to accommodate pupils from both sites therefore no pupils will be displaced by the proposed co-location.

The school will be situated at 230 Bullsmoor Lane, Enfield EN1 4RL, in new purpose built facilities.

The age range of the school will be from Years 7 to Years 11.

Admissions to the School will be as for the existing School.

The Secondary Tuition Centre (STC) accommodates students who are Enfield children who have been permanently excluded and cannot be educated at a main stream school.

As a consequence of this, Notice is given that the London Borough of Enfield, PO Box 56, Civic Centre, Silver Street, Enfield, EN1 3XQ intends to discontinue the use of these sites as the Secondary Tuition Centre, under section 15 (1) Education and Inspections Act 2006. It is proposed that the current STC school sites will close spring term 2018.

The relocation from the Eldon and Swan sites is considered necessary as it would enable the provision of co-location of the school which will improve management/organisation of vulnerable children and allow better utilisation of staff:

- provide all pupils with a state of the art new facility, which will support and enhance the delivery of the curriculum• and will enable better continuity and progression of pupils learning,
- promote high educational standards and ensure high-quality, good teaching.
- allow consistency of approach to learning policies, behaviour management, and better use of educational resources including teaching and non-teaching staff.
- provide opportunities to increase the range of expertise and experience of teaching staff and provide opportunities for improvements in the deployment and development of teachers.

There are currently 100 secondary aged pupils on roll at the STC, The majority of pupils attend full-time with the remainder taught through a part-time induction programme to introduce pupils to the centre with additional pupils attending college and other placements. These pupils are both girls and boys aged 11-16. All statutory consultees have been consulted on these proposals.
