Imagination makes things possible

The author Roald Dahl wrote 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. A boy called Charlie wins a golden ticket and enters an unusual competition set inside Willy Wonka's Chocolate factory.

C.S.Lewis, the author of 'The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe', imagined another world at the back of a wardrobe. Four children discover Narnia, a land filled with talking animals forced to live in eternal winter. They help overthow the White Witch and restore summer and the Lion King to throne.

J.K.Rowling created the fantasy story of Harry Potter. H.arry is a boy wizard battling conflict between the evil Lord Voldemort.



5 ELEMENTS



NEEDED FOR A FANTASY STORY





A magic system

Sorcery, witchcraft and enchantment. Fantastical creatures, the supernatural, and advanced abilities or powers.



A place that is completely new to the world as we know it.







A cast of characters

Is there one main character with whom your readers will experience the majority of the story in amongst a cast of others?
Think 'Lord of the Rings', by Tolkein.



Conflict

A central conflict and an inner conflict that's experienced by the characters.

Some small-scale conflict experienced between your characters creates opportunities for moments of drama and comedy.





A power structure

Who holds the power or who rules the land? How does the power and rules affect characters? Is this something they need to change, or do the rules make it harder for them to overcome their conflict?







A STORY PLOT

A story told in parts - called chapters

- 1. A beginning...
- 2. A story trigger, an event that makes life change...
- **3.** The rising action that forces characters to start finding their feet...
- **4.** A climax where the situation is at its worst. The hero confronts their enemy.
- **5.** The falling action where the hero starts to overcome or resolve the problem.
- **6.** A conclusion for the story with a happy, sad or neutral outcome.



BRILLIANT CHARACTERS


Even though a story takes place in a fantasy world, creating realistic characters makes a story more believable and relatable to the reader.





Choose a setting and a character. Add objects that could be meaningful to them. Think of interesting and everyday questions to answer.

- What's the name of the street where they live?
- What do they dream about at night?
- What's their favourite smell?
- Who, or what are they most frightened of?
- Is there a secret that only they know?





CONVINCING CHARACTERS

Characters need a personality. Strengths and weakness, flaws and special skills make them unique and will influence how they react to the sequence of events.

Get to know your characters before you write your story.


The hero manages to overthrow the conflict and the situation.
