



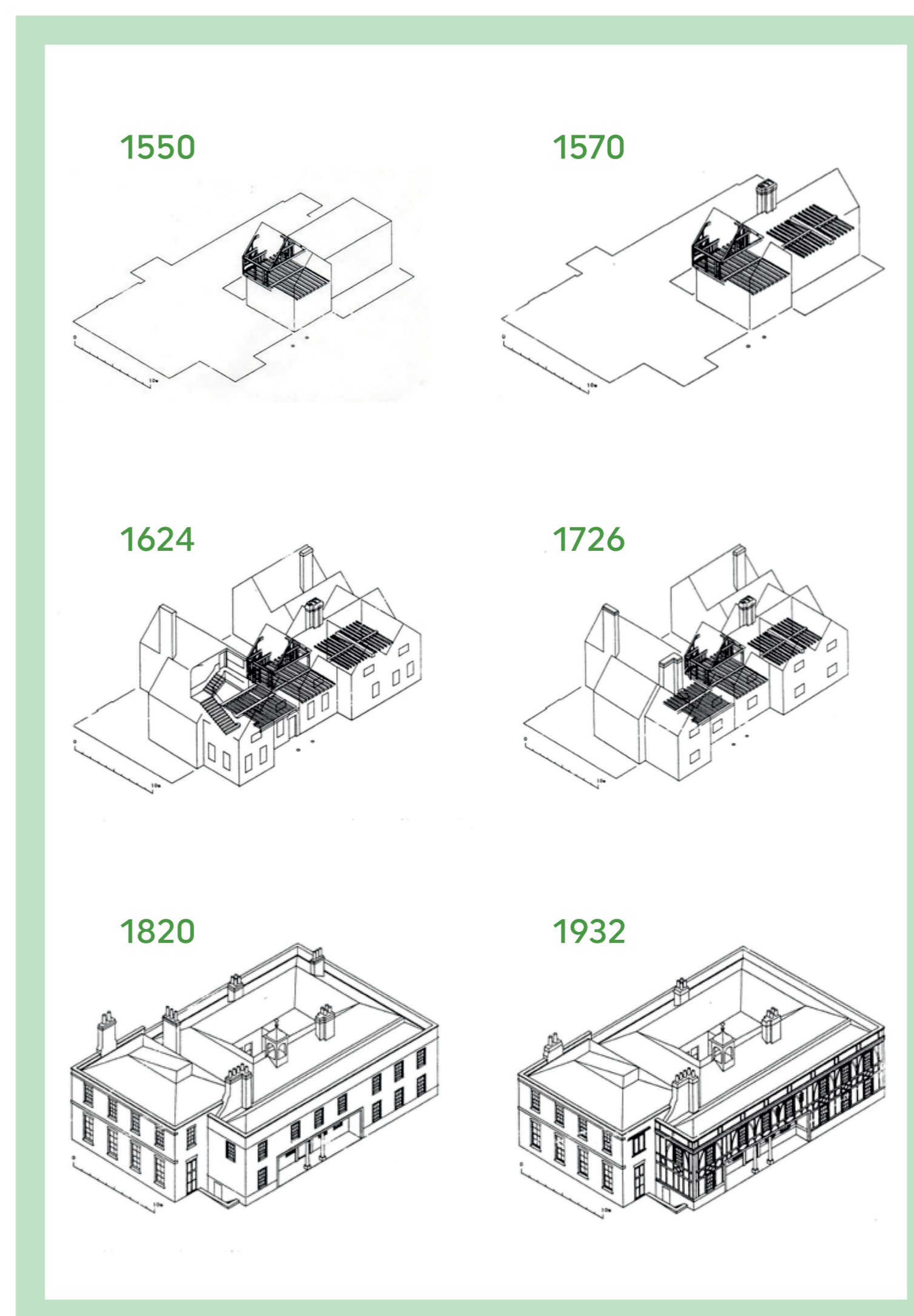
Unlocking Broomfield

Broomfield House: A Journey Through Time

Broomfield House was built around 1550. Many different landowners and merchants owned it over the years. The first map from the 1570s shows a "gentleman's house" called "Brumfeyld." The house got bigger as rich city merchants added to it.

In 1726, an artist named Gerard Lanscroun painted murals around the new staircase. Mrs. Judith Jackson asked him to do this.

By 1820, the old house was covered with a new, stylish front. It stayed like this until 1932 when the Southgate Urban District Council added the black and white design we see today.
