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| Things to look for: Do the children look happy and engaged in their play or with adults? | The sort of activities you should see children taking part in: painting, drawing, cuttings and sticking imaginative play with the sand, water play or kitchen/home corner |
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| Do the staff look happy in what they are doing? | listening to stories or looking at books |

| Can you hear the staff talking and interacting with the children? | jigsaws, puzzles and table top games |
