



7.1 GLOSSARY

If you require further information on any terms in this document please also refer to the glossary included in the Core Strategy which is available on our website at www.enfield.gov.uk

Affordable Housing

Housing, for rent, shared ownership or purchase, provided at a cost considered affordable in relation to incomes that are average or below average, or in relation to the price of general market housing.

Area Action Plan (AAP)

A Development Plan Document which focuses on a location undergoing significant change or in need of conservation. An AAP provides the spatial and planning framework for delivering development in that location.

Combined Cooling, Heat and Power (CCHP)

A power plant (producing electricity) that will also produce heat, usually in the form of steam, which can be used for heating space or water. Also known as 'cogeneration'. Both CHP and CCHP are more efficient than conventional plants because they harness heat that would otherwise be lost as a waste product.

Controlled Parking Zones (CPZ)

A controlled parking zone is an area where parking is restricted during the controlled hours of operation. The main aim of the CPZ is to discourage commuter and long stay parking by people from outside the area.

Core Strategy

A Development Plan Document setting out the overall spatial vision and strategic objectives of the borough.

Local Plan (formerly Local Development Framework)

Term used to describe a folder of documents, which includes all the local planning authority's local development documents.

London Plan

A Spatial Development Strategy for the capital produced by the Mayor of London. The London Plan is the strategic plan setting out an integrated social, economic and environmental framework for the future development of London looking forward 15–20 years

Masterplan

A planning document which sets out priorities for regenerating an area and identifies sites where development can happen to deliver regeneration

Regeneration Priority Areas

An area identified by the council as a priority for bringing prosperity through regeneration projects. Regeneration Priority Areas are New Southgate, Ponders End, Edmonton Green, Enfield Town and Meridian Water.

Stakeholders

Anyone with an interest in the plan such as a resident, business, community group or landowner.

Supplementary Planning Document


A planning document that covers a specific theme or area and provides further detail of policies and proposals in other Local Plans/ Development Plan Documents.

THE PLANNING SYSTEM AND LOCAL PLAN (Formerly the Development Framework)

The Edmonton Green Masterplan is one of a number of documents that make up Enfield's planning framework (known as the Local Plan). The diagram below sets out all of the documents that are used to guide development and regeneration in Enfield:

Enfield Core Strategy 2010

The Core Strategy sets out the overarching policy for the future of Edmonton Green:

Core Strategy Policy 39 Edmonton

In the Edmonton area existing and new socio-economic programmes will be complemented by visible physical and public realm enhancements aimed to improve the function and reputation of the area. Physical change is likely to focus on reorganising the existing urban fabric of the Edmonton Green town centre to improve its function and appearance and create a more liveable environment.

Further housing, shops and employment will also be needed to reinforce and enhance the identity of the area, its role as a District Centre and to help implement socio-economic change through the provision of training facilities, employment opportunities and to create a better mix of tenures. In the wider context, interventions will promote better connections to nearby centres including Angel Edmonton and Enfield Town and the new community at Meridian Water, and help to create safer, more accessible streets for walking and cycling.

The Council will work with other members of the Enfield Strategic Partnership to develop a Single Implementation Plan to coordinate place shaping in the wider Edmonton/Central Leaside area. The Plan will focus on liveability as well as physical change in accordance with six overarching strands which together constitute the Partnership's ambitions for the area:

- Improving travel and infrastructure;
- Supporting the young and the vulnerable;
- Pathways to prosperity;
- Delivering quality neighbourhoods;
- Ensuring stronger and cohesive communities; and
- Reducing health inequalities.
