Thinking about moving to a Care Home?

In this part of our guide we help you think through your options and decide what is best for you. It explains various aspects of the move such as paying for care and assessing your needs.

This has been written for someone considering moving into a care home, but also anyone who is assisting a relative or friend confront the various issues they may need to consider.

There are many reasons you might be thinking about moving into a care home. You may be less able to look after yourself, and things like cooking, washing or dressing are getting tricky. Perhaps you're worried about being alone at night or having a fall. Or perhaps you're feeling lonely. Moving into a care home can give you a renewed purpose in life and can be a chance to meet new people and start new friendships. A care home has trained staff on hand, and often specialist equipment that can't be installed in your own house – which means many of the difficulties and risks you might face at home are removed.

After reading this guide, visiting a few care homes and taking advice from people close to you, you may feel happier about the decision you make.

Starting the process

Firstly, you need to get a free Care Needs Assessment from your local Council.

A Social Care professional will assess your needs and consider how you are coping. They will take account of

things like your health, living arrangements, cultural and religious needs, social needs and what help you are currently getting. Your doctor may also be consulted if you have specific health needs.

After the assessment the Council will decide if you meet their eligibility criteria for support. If you do it will set out a Care and Support plan for you.

The Council will also consider whether home care and adaptations could allow you to continue living at home or also whether extra care housing could be suitable.

The Council legally has to ensure that your needs are safely met. But if you are still able to make and communicate decisions then you have the right to remain at home if you want to.

If you already receive help from social services, they may recommend you move into a care home. Also, if you are being discharged from hospital it may be recommended that you move to a care home.

Challenging the care needs assessment

You are entitled to ask for a review of any decision that is made. Or further to that you can make a formal complaint if you are unhappy with the review. The Council should give you all the information you need to do this. If you are still unhappy with the response you can refer the matter to the Local Government and Social Care Ombudsman.

NHS care in a care home

If the Council thinks you might be eligible for NHS-arranged and funded care, they should refer you to the NHS for an assessment. This assessment looks at whether you're eligible for NHS continuing healthcare

(CHC) or an NHS-funded nursing contribution, as described below:

If you mainly have healthcare needs, you might be eligible for CHC. This is based on the nature, intensity, complexity and unpredictability of your needs, rather than on a particular health condition or diagnosis. It can be provided in any setting, including nursing and residential care homes. If you're eligible, the NHS arranges and meets the full cost of your care.

If you're not eligible for CHC, you should be assessed for NHS-funded nursing care. If you're eligible, the care home receives a weekly contribution direct from the NHS towards the cost of your nursing care.

Paying for care

If your care needs assessment finds that your needs should be met in a care home, and your total assets are worth less than £23,250, you might be eligible for financial assistance to help pay for your care.

Who will pay for my care home place?

The Council will assess your finances to find out what you'll have to pay towards your fees, and whether you're entitled to financial help. You'll be asked:

- about your income, including any pensions
- about your capital (the total amount of your savings and other assets, such as shares)
- about any benefits you're eligible for, including the Guarantee Credit part of Pension Credit (even if you're not receiving any benefits, the Council will assume you're claiming what you can when it assesses your income)
- whether you own any property – the value of your home is included in the assessment unless certain people still live there.

When carrying out the assessment, the Council must:

- disregard certain benefits, including the Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payment mobility components
- exclude the income and savings of your spouse or partner
- ignore half of any personal or occupational pension or retirement annuity income if you're giving it to a spouse or civil partner, and they don't live in the same care home.

In England, Councils have upper and lower limits for

financial help. If you have capital assets that are:

over £23,250, you have to pay your own fees as a 'self funder'

between £14,250 and £23,250, you qualify for financial support from the Council and pay a contribution from your income – such as pensions – plus a 'tariff income'

under £14,250, the Council provides financial support, and you'll contribute from your income – with no tariff income.

The tariff income assumes you have an extra £1 per week in income for every £250 (or part of) you have between £14,250 and £23,250 in capital. So, for example, if you have £15,000 in capital, you need to pay £3 weekly in tariff income.

After the assessment, the Council calculates what you should contribute to the care home fees, while leaving you an amount for personal expenses. This amount is known as the Personal Expenses Allowance (PEA) and is currently £25.65 per week.

Will I have to sell my home?

It can be worrying to think you might have to sell your home to pay for your care home place, but this isn't always the case. The value of your home will be ignored in the Council's financial assessment if any of the following people still live there:

- your spouse, civil partner
- a relative who is 60 or over

- a relative under 60 who has a disability.

Local Councils can also disregard the value of your property at their discretion, even if someone living there doesn't fit into one of the above categories. They don't have to – but they should consider any requests to do so.

If your home is taken into account in the means test, you have several options. The rules around having to sell your home can be complicated, particularly with jointly-owned property, so take specialist advice if necessary.

12 weeks to decide

If you live in England, your property is ignored for the first 12 weeks of your care home placement. This means you should be entitled to financial help from the Council for the first 12 weeks – as long as your other capital assets are less than £23,250.

This is known as a '12-week property disregard' and gives you time to decide whether you want to sell your house or enter into a deferred payment agreement (see below).

Deferred payment of care home fees

Every Council must offer a deferred payment agreement (DPA) to homeowners if they meet certain eligibility criteria. A DPA means the Council agrees to provide financial help with your care home fees, on the basis that you pay the Council back from your property at a later date.

You can choose to do this either when the property is sold or from your estate when you die. It's worth being

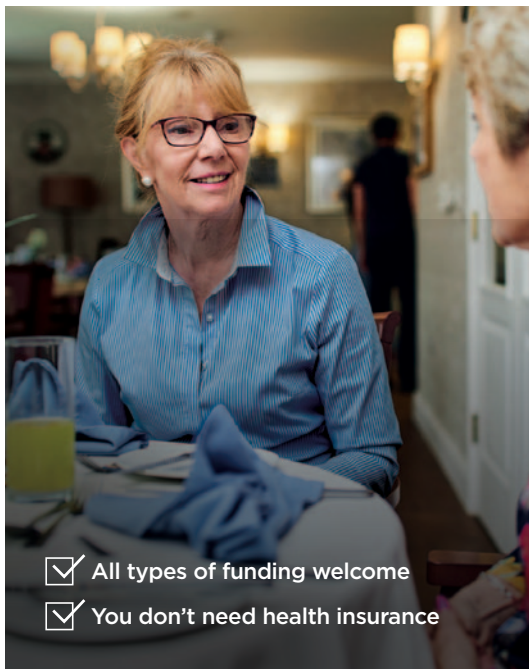

aware that the Council can charge an administration fee to set up the DPA and you can be charged interest on deferred fees. If you're thinking about a DPA, you should seek independent financial advice before signing anything.

Third party top-up fees

If the Council is funding your place in a residential home, they calculate an amount of money to meet your care needs as part of your care and support plan. This is known as your 'personal budget' and must be enough to meet your assessed needs. The Council must be able to show that there is at least one suitable care home available at your personal budget amount.

Your personal budget should account for your individual needs. For example, if your needs assessment shows you need a care home close to family, this should be reflected in your personal budget amount.

If you choose a home that is more expensive than your personal budget, you can still move there if someone – such as a family member – agrees to pay the difference between your personal budget and the cost of the care home. This is called a 'top-up' fee. In most circumstances, you can't pay your own top-up – only if your property comes under the 12-week disregard or you're getting help with your fees under a deferred payment agreement.

If there isn't a suitable home available within your personal budget, you shouldn't be asked to pay a top-up fee. Instead, the Council must increase your personal budget.

Paying for your own care home place

If the Council's financial assessment shows that you have to pay for your own place in a care home, you're known as a 'self-funder'. The Council can expect you to make your own care home arrangements, as long as you can do so, or you have family or friends able to help you. However, your local Council should still provide you with information and advice about arranging a care home.

If the Council's care needs assessment shows that you require a nursing home place and you qualify for NHS-funded nursing care, the home will receive a weekly payment from the NHS towards the nursing element of your care fees. Look at the care home's terms and conditions to see how the fees take account of this payment.

Care home fees vary widely depending on the area, and different rooms have different prices. The average is around £700 a week for a residential care home place and just under £1000 a week for a nursing home.

Think long term. Will you be able to afford these fees over the coming years? What happens if you run out of money? You could ask the home if it would let you stay on at the Council's standard weekly rate.

Reassessing your capital

If your capital falls below the threshold for paying for care, you might become eligible for financial help from the council. It's usually best to contact the Council a few months before your capital falls below the threshold so there's time to carry out any necessary assessments.

If your home is more expensive than your personal

budget set by the Council, you might be asked to move to a smaller room or to a different home – or to find someone to pay the extra expense as a ‘top-up’.

Claiming benefits

If you’re paying the fees yourself, you can continue to claim Attendance Allowance, the care component of Disability Living Allowance, or the daily living component of Personal Independence payment.

Choosing a care home

Choosing the right care home is a big decision, but you don’t need to make it alone.

Talking things through with loved ones, taking them with you on visits, and listening to their opinions can really help. But the final decision is yours – only you can know which is the right home for you.

How to find the right care home

There are different ways to find care homes: Ask friends, relatives or neighbours about their experiences with care homes. But bear in mind that homes change – and what suits one person may not suit another.

Contact the Care Quality Commission (CQC), the national independent regulator of all health and social care services in England. It inspects and monitors care homes and can provide impartial information. All inspected care homes must have a copy of their ratings on display and make their latest report available.

Before you visit a care home:

Read the home’s brochure or website, and call or

email to speak to the staff or manager. Read the most recent inspection report. You can ask the home for it or look for it on the CQC website (www.cqc.org.uk). The CQC requires registered services to be safe, effective, caring, responsive and well led.

Make sure the home provides the level of care you need or are likely to need in the future.

Check if the home currently has any vacancies. If it doesn’t, find out how long the waiting list is.

When you find somewhere you’re happy with, you can visit it more than once. You might even be able to move in for a trial period.

The care home contract

Before moving in, read the terms of the care home’s contract carefully. The contract should include details of:

- the fees and what they cover
- how fees may increase, how this is worked out, and how much notice is given if anything changes
- the required deposit (if any)
- the services charged for on top of the basic fees
- the notice period for leaving (and how much notice the care home gives if it wants a resident to move out)
- what is covered by the care home’s insurance
- how temporary absences (such as hospital stays) are charged
- the complaints procedure
- any charges that may be due after a resident’s death

Getting care and support at home

As we get older, it can become more difficult to look after ourselves and our homes, and we might need a helping hand with those things that keep us and our homes ticking along. There are a range of services that can help you, whether its help with housework or with personal care, such as eating and drinking, going to the toilet and personal hygiene, or with getting out and about.

There are many forms of care and support your local Council might have a duty to provide, but this will depend on your needs. If you're having problems managing at home or with any of the examples listed below, contact the Council about a care needs assessment as outlined previously.

Help around the house

Sometimes, just a little support with the housework or gardening means you can enjoy living at home without worrying about how you'll get everything done.

Help with cleaning

If you could use some help with cleaning, start by asking around for recommendations. You'll be inviting a new person into your home, so it's important to find someone you trust.

Help with cooking

If you're finding it difficult to cook, you could buy ready meals from the supermarket, or try one of the specialist companies that provide frozen or chilled meals ready for you to heat up. Some also offer hot meals. You can ring these companies for a catalogue and many have



websites with detailed menu and dietary options. There might also be lunch clubs in your area or you could also be eligible for Meals on Wheels.

Help with DIY and gardening

Doing DIY or small jobs around the home and garden can be a chore, especially if you aren't as mobile as you used to be.

Help taking care of yourself

You can get help with personal care such as eating and drinking, going to the toilet and personal hygiene, as well as support taking care of your appearance.

Help getting out and about

If you're finding it difficult to get out and about by yourself

then you might like some help with transport. Whether it's going to your weekly book club or your local day centre, there's help available to make sure you can access the services and activities that are important to you. There might be a transport service such as Dial-a-Ride in your area that can help you get to the shops. This is a door-to-door minibus service for people who can't use public transport. Drivers are trained to help people who have mobility problems.

Home adaptations

Simple changes to your home can help you continue to live independently and safely. For example, a grab rail at the front door to help you step inside or an entry intercom to help you answer the door might make a big difference to how you live.

You can also make more substantial changes, such as fitting your home with a stairlift or an accessible shower. Start by contacting the social services department of your local Council. Someone will assess your needs to see if you're eligible for help.

Help with your care costs

If the Council decides you're eligible for support or care, it can arrange or provide those services for you. But if you want more choice and control, there are other options.

Help with care costs from the Council

Following a needs assessment, the Council has to do a financial assessment to work out whether you're entitled to help with the cost of your care.

If you're entitled to help with care costs, the Council

has to work out how much, if any, you can be charged for the cost of your care. When the Council is working out how much you can be charged, it needs to make sure you're left with a minimum amount of income for day-to-day costs, known as your 'Minimum Income Guarantee' (MIG). You must also be left with money for housing-related costs, such as rent, mortgage repayments and Council Tax. If your disability benefits are included in the financial assessment, the Council should allow you to keep enough benefit for you to meet any disability-related expenses. Check your local Council's website for its charging information. If you think the fee is unreasonable, ask for a review. If you're still not happy, use the Council's complaints procedure.

Arranging and paying for your care services

In England, if you're eligible for financial support the Council must provide you with a personal budget. This is a budget to arrange and pay for your care and support. The amount of money depends on your needs as set out in your care plan. There are different ways you can manage this money:

- You can get the Council to manage it and arrange services for you. The Council spends the money on services to meet your needs.
- You can directly receive the money in your personal budget and spend it as you choose on services that meet your needs as set out in your care plan. This is called a direct payment.

Direct payments allow you to be more flexible. You could use them to choose your own carers, people you feel comfortable with and who can visit you regularly,

rather than having different carers each time. You might want to pay someone to help you go shopping, for example. Also, if you have a place of worship, or you want to do a course, you can use the money you've been allocated to get you there. You can use it in a variety of ways, as long as it meets the needs in your care plan.

Direct payments are not right for everyone. You might have to take on the duties of an employer, depending on your support or care needs. You can get support with this from your local Council. You can also nominate someone to receive and manage the money for you if you don't feel able to do it yourself.

However you arrange your care, it's your choice. If you choose not to receive direct payments, the Council must arrange or provide care services for you.

Arranging your own care and support

If you're paying for your own care and support at home – either privately or through direct payments – there are a number of ways you can find a provider.

Home care agencies

An agency can provide carers who will support you to live independently at home. They can help you with activities such as getting in and out of bed, washing, getting dressed, preparing a meal or collecting medication. The duration and number of visits depends on your needs.

Ask agencies to send you a brochure and their price list or look for one on their website. Customer reviews can be useful, but you should always contact the agencies you like to see if they're right for you before

committing.

Your chosen agency will do its own care needs assessment to find out what help you need. It should produce a care plan showing your carer's arrival times, what they'll do, how long they'll stay and any other relevant information. This should be reviewed yearly, or more often if your needs change.

Employing someone directly

Instead of using an agency, you may prefer to employ someone directly to help you. If you do this, you'll need to handle their tax, National Insurance and pension. Skills for Care has useful resources for employing someone directly on their website:

You must make sure you're insured in case your carer has an accident. You should consider getting a DBS check for the person you employ, as this helps you know whether they have had a criminal conviction. You can't generally use direct payments to employ a partner or relative who lives with you, but the Council should allow this if it's necessary to meet your needs. Think about how employing a partner or relative could affect your relationship, and check if becoming a paid carer affects their eligibility for benefits.

How much will it cost?

Home care costs can vary depending on where you live, the kind of care you need, the amount of care you need and what times of the day and week you need it. If you're a self-funder, it's worth looking at a number of providers to get a better idea of the price range.

Even if the Council isn't paying for your care, it can

help with information and advice about local care services. This will give you an idea of the cost of care and the range of providers in your area. Self-funders also have the right to a needs assessment from their local Council and the assessment can help you find and plan appropriate care. While cost is important, it needs to be balanced against the quality of care.

What should I do if I'm not happy with the care I'm receiving?

If you're unhappy with your care, first try to resolve it by having an informal conversation with your local Council or care agency. If that doesn't work, you can make a formal complaint to the Council if it arranged or provided the services. If you have made private, self-funded arrangements, you can make a complaint using the provider's complaints procedure.

If you're not happy with the outcome of the complaint, you can ask the Local Government and Social Care Ombudsman to investigate. The Ombudsman deals with complaints made about Councils, as well as care providers. You can also tell the Care Quality Commission about your complaint.

Neglect and abuse

Neglect can take the form of a carer not turning up when they should, or not giving the correct medication on time. It can also be someone ignoring your personal hygiene needs or not providing you with the support you need. Abuse can take different forms, including (but not limited to) physical, psychological, sexual and financial abuse. If you experience neglect or abuse from anyone who cares for you, or you feel you're at risk of neglect

or abuse, contact the local Council safeguarding team immediately. The Council has a safeguarding duty to take action in response to concerns about abuse or neglect where necessary.

What if I need more help at home?

You may start to feel like you need more support at home. You might not be as mobile or have as much energy as you once did, and your needs may change. If this happens, you can always ask your local Council to review your needs. They'll see if they can provide any additional services, or whether you're now eligible for help you haven't had before. If you're receiving direct payments, this review may result in an increase in funding.

If you're employing your own carers, see if you can afford to employ them for a few extra hours. Talk to the agency (if you're using one) to see what it can offer. There may come a time when your current home is no longer suitable, even with care, support or adaptations. If this happens, the options you could consider include:

- downsizing to a more manageable property
- moving in with family
- moving into sheltered housing
- moving into a care home.

It can be understandably difficult to think about leaving your home, especially if you've lived there a long time, but it's a good idea to consider your options and discuss them with friends and family well in advance. You can then be sure you've made your wishes known and thought about what's best for you.

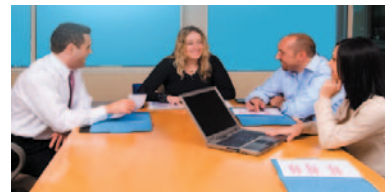

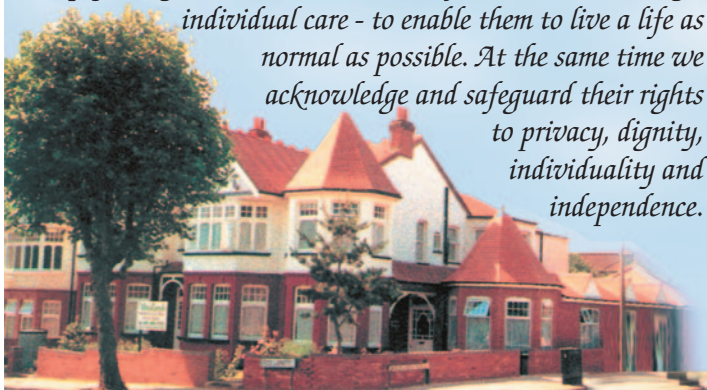
