	Metropolitan Police – CI Petra Lazar  Very little change from a Brexit point of view. Not aware of any central London protests linked to Brexit. Resources to be more local on New Year's Eve. Hopeful that people will abide by the new rules as difficult as they are for everybody. No change on the tension reports with regards to Brexit or hate crimes, which is positive.	
	Libraries - Lee Shelsher Libraries remain open for PC access and click and collect. Partners can still operate. Still liaising with CAB. Visa verification 7000 appointments in 6 months.	
	Health leads (external & internal) - Andrew Wright Supporting staff in applying for settled status.  Medications, pharmaceuticals, NHS managing this centrally so department of health co-ordinating at a national level. All medications are category 1 and would come in via air freight. Therefore, blockades are not a problem in the short term and that also includes clinical equipment and supplies. Issues may occur longer term in January and February, wider implications e.g. fuel shortages staff getting to work. We have at least 3 months supply of medicines and clinical equipment but if these supplies cannot be replenished in the next month or two this could have a longer-term impact. These issues being dealt by the department of Health at a national level rather than individual NHS organisations so there is a well organised plan.
