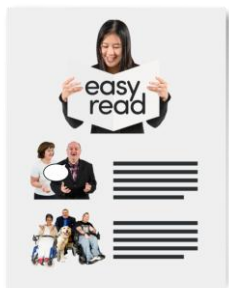


Enfield Integrated Learning Disability Service- Who we work with



An Easy Read Guide



The Enfield Integrated Learning Disability Service (EILDS) is a team of health and social care staff from Enfield Council and the North London NHS Foundation Trust.



We support adults (18+) with a learning disability, their families and supporters.



We also work with young people 16+, alongside Children's Services, to plan their transition into adulthood.

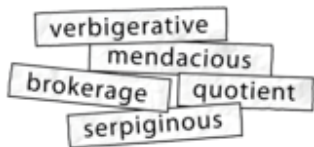


We aim to support people with learning disabilities to be healthy, independent and valued members of their community.



Learning Disability is defined by the Department of Health and Social Care.

You have a Learning Disability if you have -



Significant difficulty understanding complex information (intellectual functioning).



Difficulty with day-to-day skills (social functioning).



You have had the disability since you were a child.



This is different to specific learning difficulties, like dyslexia or dyscalculia.

To be eligible for Social Care support from EILDS, you need to live in Enfield.



To be eligible for support from the health teams at EILDS, you must be registered with a GP in Enfield.



If you have a funded care package, we may work with you to see if you would be eligible for NHS Continuing Health Care funding.



If you have a funded care package, and move to Enfield from another area, that area may continue to pay for your care package.



Getting a Service from EILDS



Anyone who thinks they may be eligible can make a referral. See contact details below.

EILDS will check all referrals to -



Determine if the person is eligible for a service.



Decide if ILDS is best placed to meet the person's needs.



If not, EILDS will signpost to who can meet the needs.



If EILDS can meet the need, we will allocate to the appropriate team or pathway, who will contact the person.
