

Library Consultation



Like all local authorities, the Council is facing significant funding pressures. The Council has had a 42% reduction in overall funding since 2010. The Council is under a duty to set a balanced budget. The Council must make savings of £39.4 million in 2024/25, and there is a forecasted budget gap of £118.7 million for the 5 years through to 2028/29. It is inevitable that savings will need to be made now and in years to come across Council services in order to set a balanced budget.

The Council is under a duty to provide a comprehensive and efficient library service. In light of these funding pressures, we need to consider whether our library service can be delivered in a more efficient way, while ensuring that it continues to meet people's needs and is comprehensive.

We want to hear from you about whether you use our library service, your experience of our libraries. We will use your feedback and ideas to help us develop a draft proposal for a new library strategy for Enfield. We will then publish and consult on this draft strategy in summer 2024. We will carefully consider any responses to that consultation and anticipate being able to finalise a new library strategy and implement any changes in early 2025.

Those who live, work and study in the borough, representatives of schools, colleges, health organisations, local business, voluntary and community sector organisations, the Metropolitan Police and the London Fire Brigade can participate in the consultation. LGBT+ History Month





Picture Book


A laugh-out-loud story about Bill, who forgets to say 'please' with when asking for something, leading to wild and funny consequences.

Children's fiction 7+


Percy the penguin is having a race with the other penguins. He wants to win but his friends need help. Will he decide to stop and help or will he carry on racing in the hope that he can win?

New In... for YA and Adults


HAGS by Victoria Smith

She also has some interesting potential solutions up her sleeve!




Cursed Bread by Sophie Mackintosh

An intriguing novel based on a true unsolved mystery.




Regretting You by Colleen Hoover
