

GENERAL CONDITIONS
FOR WORKING ON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAY

To ensure that the Heavy Duty Crossover (HDC) is constructed and maintained to a sufficient standard, Enfield Council require developers to employ competent contractors who will meet the Council's requirements both in terms of construction and ability to work on the public highway network.

1. KEY REQUIREMENTS:

- Your Contractor must be Street Works Accredited. Please provide a copy of this accreditation.
- A sum equivalent to the estimated cost of the works will need to be deposited to ensure the Council is fully protected in case a developer / contractor ceases to trade during the project or does not carry out the works to a satisfactory quality.
- The deposit will be held until the completion of the works and finalization of all costs incurred by LBE including highways fees.
- The works will be subject to a one year maintenance period. Any defects arising during this period will be the responsibility of the developer / contractor. Deposit amount can be used to rectify any defects.

2. DOCUMENTS TO BE PROVIDED PRIOR TO WORKS COMMENCING:

Completed "Application for consent for works within the highway" form

Method Statement, including proposed traffic management arrangements, for construction of the footway works

Risk Assessment for construction of the footway works

Health and Safety policy

Street Works Accreditation

Contractor's insurance details to the values indicated below;

- The minimum amount of cover for insurance in respect of loss of or damage to property (except the Employer's property, plant and materials and equipment) and liability for bodily injury to or death of a person (not an employee of the Contractor) arising from or in connection with the Contractor's providing the Service for any one event is: £10,000,000.
- The minimum limit of indemnity for insurance in respect of death of or bodily injury to employees of the Contractor arising out of and in the course of their employment in connection with this contract for any one event is £10,000,000.

3. APPROVAL:

Upon receipt of the above the Council will give full consideration to your application for using your nominated contractor to carry out the works on the Public Highway.

Once the bond, supervision, other fees and necessary documents are in place, and the works are approved to commence, the Council will arrange and provide a permit and, if necessary, temporary traffic order giving permission to work on the footway.

The Council reserves the right to refuse any application for works within the highway.

4. WORKS:

The contractor must comply with all directions given by Enfield Council engineer or supervising officers.

All works shall be undertaken in accordance with the specification for the works and all traffic management shall comply with the current edition of the Traffic Signs Manual and associated Code of Practice.

Enfield Council will suspend the works if it considers that any elements of the works are not being undertaken in compliance with its specifications and directions.
