INTRODUCTION OF A PART TIME PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE ZONE (SCHOOL STREET) FOR ENFIELD COUNTY SCHOOL FOR GIRLS (LOWER SCHOOL).

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Enfield (the Council) made The Enfield (Prescribed Routes) (School Streets) (No. 4) Traffic Order 2026 and The Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 277) Order 2026 under Section 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis.

1. The general effect of the Order, which will come into force on 13th April 2026 will be to:
 - (1) Introduce no waiting at any time restrictions in Hawthorn Grove, the north side, between the common boundary of Nos. 20 and 22 Hawthorn Grove westward for 5.6 metres.
 - (2) extend the existing pedestrian and cycle zone banning motor vehicles except permit holders during term-time on Mondays to Fridays for Enfield County Schools for Girls (Lower School) (PCZ 28) 8am to 9am and 3pm to 3.45pm in:
 - (a) Hawthorn Grove, between the junction of Acacia Road and the entrance to Lavender Primary School.
 - (b) Lavender Road, the entire length.
 - (c) Primrose Avenue, the entire length.
 - (d) Rosemary Avenue, the entire length.

Any vehicle that is already in those length of roads listed in paragraph 1 before the pedestrian and cycle zone commences will be permitted to leave.
2. A copy of the Orders and other documents giving detailed particulars about them can be inspected at the Town Library, 66 Church Street, Enfield EN2 6AX, Monday to Fridays 9am – 5pm inclusive, or online at: <https://new.enfield.gov.uk/services/roads-and-transport/traffic-management-orders/> or can also be obtained by emailing journeysandplaces@enfield.gov.uk or by writing to the Journeys and Places Team (quoting reference TG52/1589) Civic Centre, Silver Street, Enfield, Middlesex, EN1 3XD) until the end of a period of 6 weeks beginning with the date on which the Orders are made, or as the case may be, the Council decides not to make the Orders.
3. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

The Enfield (Prescribed Routes) (School Streets) (No.4) Traffic Order 2026

The Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 277) Traffic Order 2026

Statement of Reasons for making the above-named Orders

Background

The Council in July 2023 (key decision No. KD 5610) approved the School Streets Delivery Plan which included the delivery of a school street zone in 2024/25.

A school street is a road outside a school with a temporary restriction on motorised traffic at school drop-off and pick-up times with the objective of making a safer, healthier and more pleasant environment.

Objectives

The School Street proposal aims to:

1. introduce a part-time prohibition of motor vehicles during term-time at the peak drop-off and pick-up times in the locality of Enfield County School for Girls (Lower School) (PCZ 28) 8am to 9am and 3pm to 3.45pm and introduce no waiting at any time restrictions in Hawthorn Grove.
2. deliver the following improvements in this locality:
 - (1) Reduce overall motor vehicle traffic volumes in the area as a whole and reduce traffic volumes in the School Street area.
 - (2) Promote behaviour change and a modal shift towards walking, cycling and public transport.
 - (3) Deliver improved air quality.
 - (4) Reduce road danger.
 - (5) Preserve motor vehicle access so residents and local businesses can use cars and vans when they need to.

Traffic Order powers

The power to make a traffic order comes from the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the 1984 Act). For traffic authorities in greater London s.6 applies “for any of the purposes, or with respect to any of the matters, mentioned in Schedule 1” and where it appears to the authority making the Order that it is expedient to make it for the purposes of:

- s.1(1)(a) for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or
- s.1(1)(c) for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians), or
- s.1(1)(d) for preventing the use of the road by vehicular traffic of a kind which, or its use by vehicular traffic in a manner which, is unsuitable having regard to the existing character of the road or adjoining property, and
- s.1(1)(f) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs, and
- s.122(2)(b) the effect on the amenities of any locality affected and (without prejudice to the generality of this paragraph) the importance of regulating and restricting the use of roads by heavy commercial vehicles, so as to preserve or improve the amenities of the areas through which the roads run, and
- s.122(2)(d) any other matters appearing to the local authority to be relevant.

Coming into operation 13th April 2026

The Council of the London Borough of Enfield, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation 13th April 2026 and may be cited as the Enfield (School Streets) (No. 4) Traffic Order 2026.

Interpretation

2. In this Order:-

“**Bus**” has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016

“**Council**” means the Council of the London Borough of Enfield.

“**Dial-a-ride**” means a vehicle:

- (1) displaying so as to be conspicuous on the outside of a vehicle a logo in a form approved by or with the authority of the Council and containing the words “Dial-a-ride”, and
- (2) constructed or adapted for the carriage of disabled persons and their companions and which is being used to provide a service for the carriage of such person.

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in Regulation 2 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as in section 136(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

"pedestrian and cycle zone" " has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 and for the purposes of this Order refers to any street or part thereof specified in column 3 of Schedule 1 to this Order;

"permit holder", in respect of a pedestrian and cycle zone, means a person who has satisfied the Council that they have a bona fide reason for entering that pedestrian and cycle zone during the prescribed hours, and in respect of whose vehicle a permit PCZ28 for Enfield County School for Girls to enter that pedestrian and cycle zone during the prescribed hours has been issued or granted by the Council at their discretion.

"prescribed hours" means the period specified in column 4 of Schedule 1.

"term-time" means any day on which maintained schools within the London Borough of Enfield are open to students, as set out in the school term dates published by the Council for that academic year, excluding weekends, bank holidays and school holiday periods.

"traffic sign" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

"universal service provider" has the same meanings as in Part 3 of the Postal Services Act 2011;

3. Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
4. The reference in Article 6 of this Order to Diagram 618.3C shall be construed as a reference to the sign diagram in item 2 of the sign table set out in Part 2 of Schedule 8 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(b), provided that if this sign diagram is revoked and re-enacted by a subsequent enactment then reference to it in this Order shall be construed as a reference to the corresponding diagram number re-enacted by that subsequent enactment.

5. Subject to Articles 6 and 7 of this Order, no person other than a permit holder shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to enter a pedestrian and cycle zone during the prescribed hours.
6. The provisions of Article 5 of this Order shall apply only at such times during the prescribed hours as shall be indicated by the placing and displaying of a traffic sign or traffic signs of the type shown in Diagram 618.3C.
7. Nothing in Article 5 of this Order shall apply:
 - (1) in relation to any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes; or
 - (2) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer; or
 - (3) to any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; or
 - (4) in relation to any vehicle with an electronically held disabled person's badge exemption; or
 - (5) in relation to dial-a-ride buses; or
 - (6) in relation to a refuse collection vehicle, whilst being used for purpose of the collection of refuse from premises either located within, or only accessible therefrom a street within a pedestrian and cycle zone; or
 - (7) in relation to a mechanical street cleansing vehicle, whilst being used for purpose of the cleansing of a street within a pedestrian and cycle zone.
 - (8) in relation to a vehicle being used for the purpose of the provision of a universal postal service, provided the vehicle bears the livery of a universal postal service provider; or
 - (9) in relation to anything done with the written permission of the Council of the London Borough of Enfield or its representative, provided that any conditions or requirements they may impose are being complied with.

The Enfield (Prescribed Routes) (School Streets) (No. 4) Traffic Order 2026

The general effect of the Order is to introduce pedestrian and cycle zones in the locations in the Schedule to this Order. The closure points of the pedestrian and cycle zones are as follows:-

- 1) **Hawthorn Grove**, from a point 5.5 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Acacia Road.
- 2) **Lavender Road**, from a point 3.5 metres north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line of Lancaster Road.
- 3) **Primrose Avenue**, from a point 2 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Baker Street.
- 4) **Rosemary Avenue**, from a point 2 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Baker Street.

3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 2012(b) shall have effect as though:
 - (1) for the item numbered 1779 in Schedule 1 to that Order there were substituted the items similarly numbered and set out in Schedule 1 to this Order
