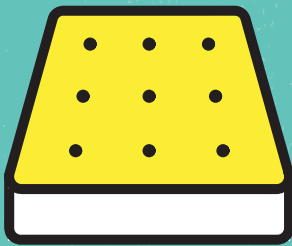




Free Bulky Waste Collection Service

Book online for your free collection service. Dumping bulky waste not only blights Enfield but we will investigate and prosecute offenders.

- armchairs, sofas and futons
- bathroom furniture (plastic or ceramic only)
- beds (bed base, mattress and headboard are counted as one item)
- carpets and rugs (put them in bags for collection)
- doors
- dustbins
- fence panels (must be tied into manageable bundles with all nails removed)
- mirrors
- plastic water tanks
- rotary washing lines
- satellite dishes
- tables and chairs
- trampolines (taken apart)
- wood flooring (must be tied into manageable bundles with all nails removed)

Help from Enfield Council

- Enfield Council now has a free Bulky Waste Collection Service. Visit: www.enfield.gov.uk/bulkywaste to book your collection.
- You can apply for a larger rubbish bin if there are five or more permanent residents in your house, at least two children in nappies or you produce large amounts of medical or incontinence waste. A larger rubbish bin is chargeable, please visit the website for more details.
- Your bins should not be used for DIY/ large household items. These can be taken to Barrowell Green Reuse and Recycling Centre, Winchmore Hill N21 3AU.

By recycling all your food waste in your brown bin, which is collected weekly, you will free up space in your black bin.

Many other items can be recycled in your local area such as textiles and batteries - check out your local collection points and charitable organisations. www.recyclenow.com/local-recycling

Tips to reduce waste

- Reduce single-use plastic:
 - use reusable water bottles and coffee cups
 - use paper or metal drinking straws and cutlery
 - shop with reusable bags
- Use reusable nappies, as disposable nappies generate a lot of waste. Real nappies can help you reduce your waste and save money. We encourage reusable nappies to parents with a baby under eighteen months, or parents-to-be, living in the borough with a £70 voucher at www.realnappiesforlondon.org.uk

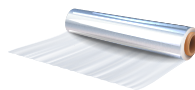

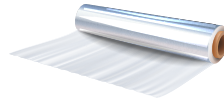

What can go in your **brown** food recycling bin (Weekly collection)



- Fish and meat bones
- 100% compostable liners (with the seedling logo)
- Cooked and uncooked food (including meat)
- Egg shells
- General food waste
- Coffee grounds



What can't go in your food recycling bin

- Plastic bags or liners
- General rubbish (e.g. packaging)
- Garden waste (including leaves, house plants and soil)
- Pet waste
- Liquids (e.g. oil, milk)



Barrowell Green Recycling Centre – Winchmore Hill, London, N21 3AR

Barrowell Green Recycling Centre is Enfield's key location for residents to take their extra waste and recycling. It operates on an appointment-only basis. Pedestrian access is permitted without an appointment.

- Tuesday to Sunday, 8am to 6pm (April to September)
- Tuesday to Sunday, 8am to 4pm (October to March)

These dates may be subject to changes over the Christmas and New Year period.

To encourage reuse and recycling, we have opened the Revive reuse shop at Barrowell Green Recycling Centre. The shop sells donated items including clothing - furniture - ornaments, trinkets and glassware - toys and games.

Paid for garden waste collection service



- The new, optional, paid for garden waste service is a fortnightly collection of a small 140 litre or larger 240 litre green lidded garden waste bin.
- The annual charge for the garden waste collection service is £100 per bin and runs from April to March.

Waste and recycling collections

Bins should be placed out for collection on your scheduled collection day on the boundary edge of your property with the lids closed.



If your bins are not emptied on your collection day, you can report this within 24 hours of your scheduled collection day online at www.enfield.gov.uk

The reasons why your bin may not be emptied include:

- It contained incorrect items
- It was not out for collection
- It was too heavy
- Our vehicles could not access your road

If you place incorrect items in your bins, this causes problems at our sorting facility. Please take care to recycle correctly.

Extra recycling in clear, untied sacks will be collected as well as flattened cardboard. This can be placed neatly alongside your recycling bin on your scheduled collection day.

Extra general rubbish and sacks of general waste will **not** be taken.
