

Dear Sirs,

We have lived in **Aldersbrook Avenue, EN1 3JF** for the past 30 years and are ***wholeheartedly opposed*** to the Borough's draft local plan, much of which is proposed for our open greenbelt countryside.

Enfield is a beautiful and historic Borough, but the Council seems hell bent on changing the landscape forever whilst they are in power.

We are particularly opposed to:-

Whitewebbs (this was used regularly by a fantastic, diverse group of men, women and children and has now been taken from us for the benefit of THFC).

- a big expansion of the Spurs football training ground to the north of Whitewebbs Lane up to the M25, comprising of 42.5 hectares of land, for "professional sport, recreation and community sports/leisure uses" ([SA62 page 383 & SP CL4 pages 277-279](#));

Crews Hill (Nurseries and facilities are of great value to us as regular users of their garden centres etc.)

- 3,000 new houses in a 'sustainable settlement' at Crews Hill with the potential for longer term expansion ([Policy SP PL9, pages 77-80 and Concept Plan Figure 3.10](#))

We feel that the Borough does not work with its residents/groups, for example, The Enfield Society as they are ultimately the people who have Enfield's historic heritage right at the centre of their campaigns.

More and more people are leaving Enfield because of what is being proposed at present and more will follow if the plans go ahead.

We understand that more housing may be necessary, but who will occupy these new developments? Social housing? What about the young people of Enfield who want to continue living in the area they were brought up in, but find themselves unable to purchase anything as we understand that a lot of the new proposed developments appear to be being built mainly for social housing.
